#### Call for proposals

The <u>VCU Libraries Social Welfare History Project</u> is seeking proposals for articles related to the intersections of public health and social welfare. Open to all, including graduate students!

- Proposals should be 1 to 3 paragraphs in length; final articles will be between 2,500 to 5,500 words in length.
- Articles are well-researched and scholarly in nature, but should be useful to and understood by a wide range of undergraduate and graduate students.
  Articles might provide a broad overview of a topic, or they might discuss a particular topic in more depth. Examples can be viewed <u>here</u>.
- Authors retain copyright and will receive an honorarium, as well as a VCU Publishing Research Award that can be indicated on their CV.
- Proposals can be submitted via email to LibSWHP@vcu.edu.
- There is no deadline for proposals.

#### New registration process for scoping reviews

Information provided by Dr. Richard Brown:

Systematic reviews now require authors to follow Prisma guidelines and it is recommended to register the review in Prospero. As I was working on a scoping review with Ghader, we connected with Samantha Guss who informed us about a registration system, similar to Prospero, but for scoping reviews. The registration process is through the Center for Open Science (OSF). The registration process is simple and fast. Once registered you will receive a registration number that you can add to your scoping review paper much like a Prospero registration number.


