
Awards & Honors

On May 30th, a special meeting was held for the Contigo Project, a collaboration between VCU, Georgetown University (GU), and La Casa de la Salud (LCS). The group celebrated its collective efforts in surpassing its annual recruitment goals by 142%, thanks to the dedicated work of LCS's community health workers (CHWs). During the event, VCU and GU presented all CHWs with small gifts in recognition of their hard work. The event was attended by LCS CHWs, the coordinator, and its director, Dr. Antonio Villa, as well as Dr. Vanessa Sheppard (VCU) and Dr. Alejandra Hurtado de Mendoza (GU).

The Contigo Project aims to enhance genetic counseling and testing uptake, as well as to improve psychosocial outcomes for Latina women at risk for hereditary breast and ovarian cancer.


